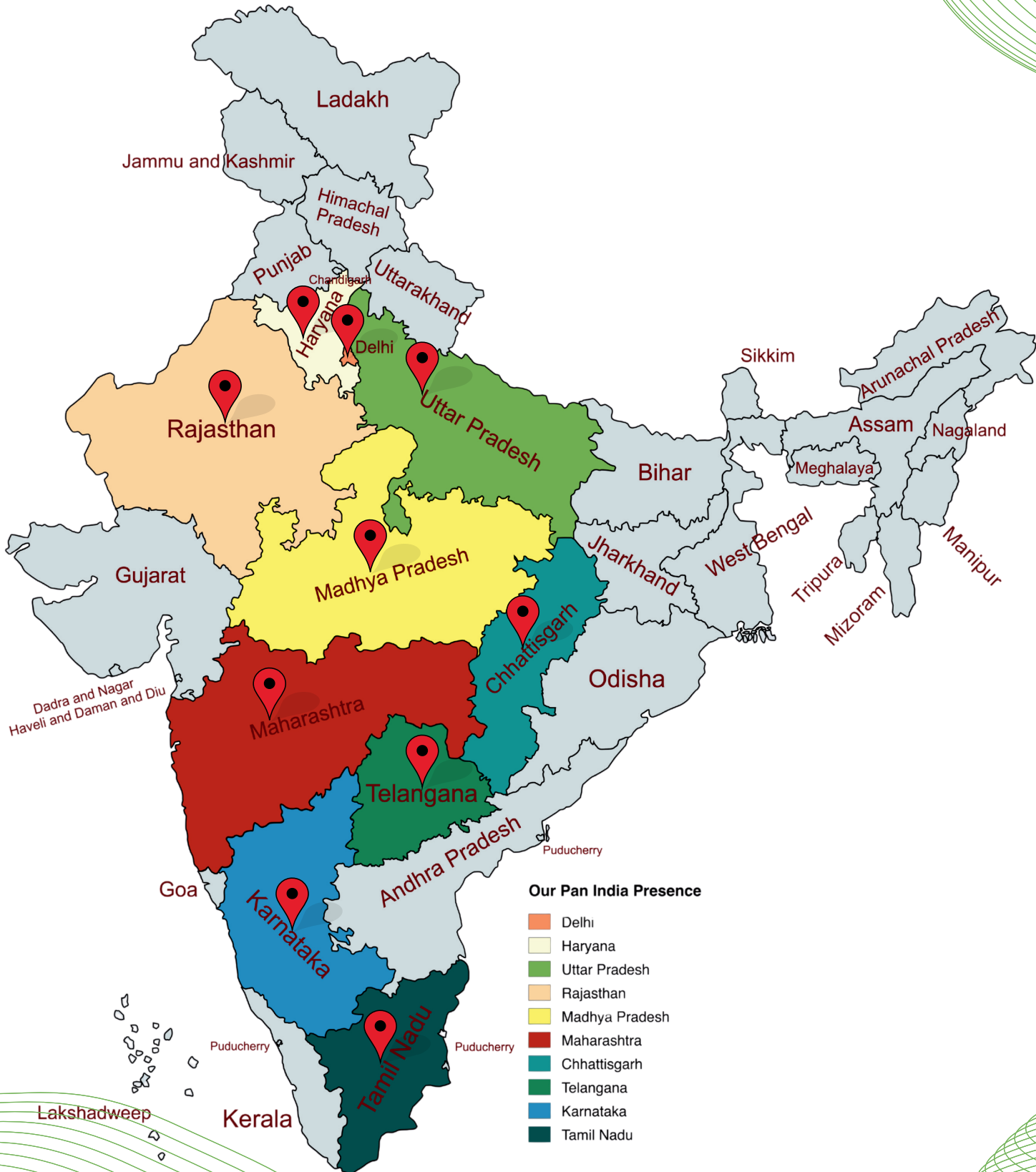

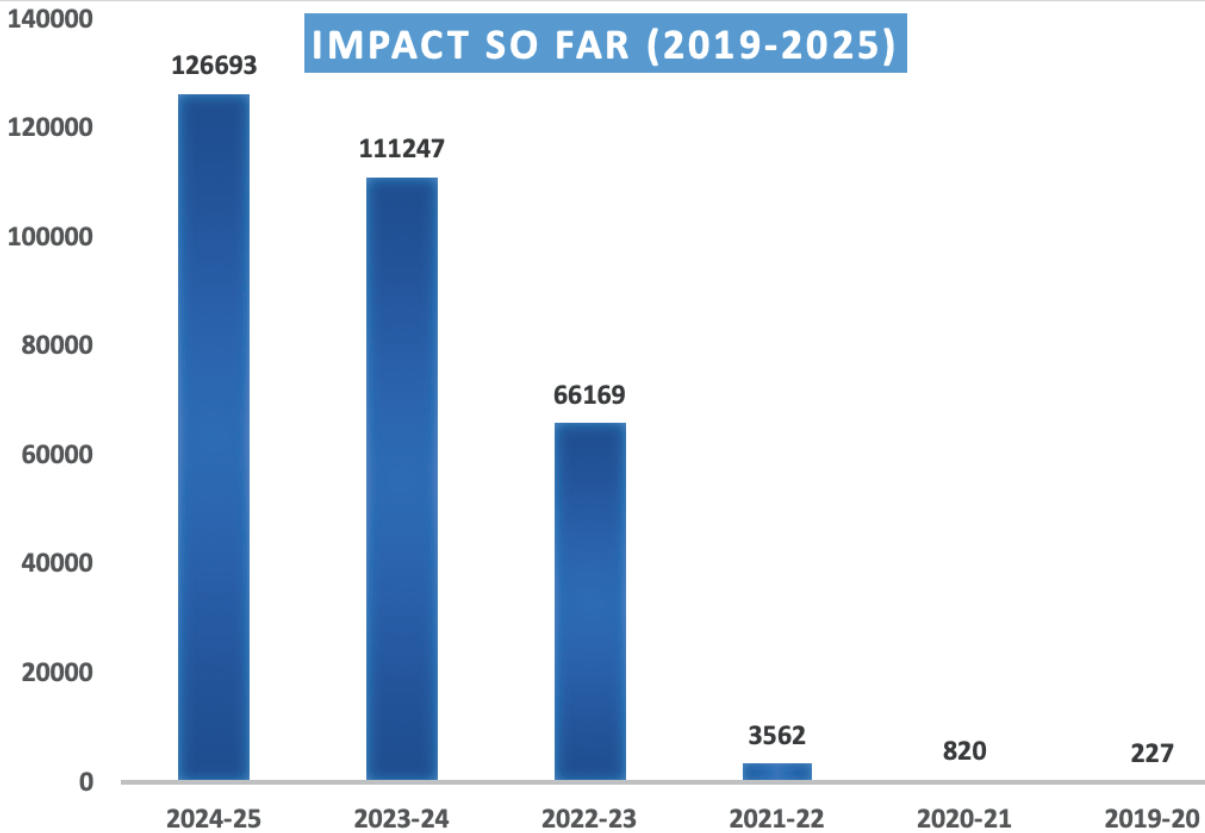

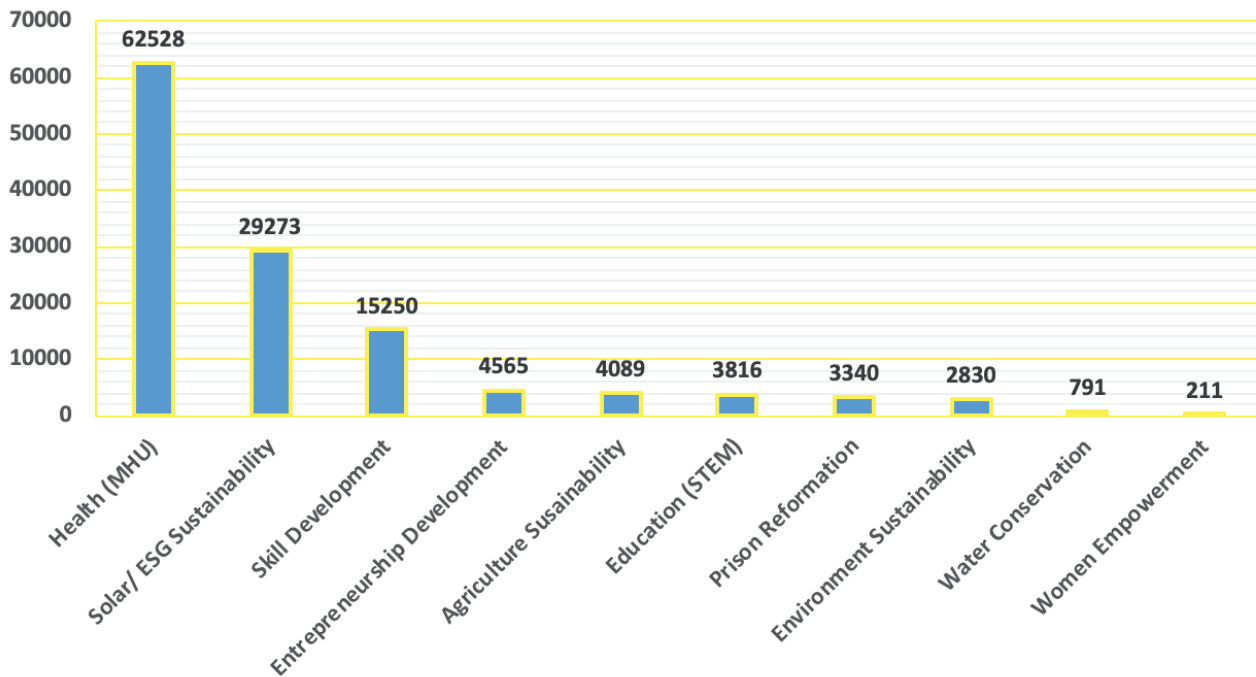

Water Conservation

Charvi Empowerment Society's Watershed Development Program is a strategic intervention aimed at addressing the pressing issue of water scarcity and ensuring long-term water security in rural Bangalore. The initiative focuses on rainwater harvesting, groundwater recharge, and sustainable water conservation practices, thereby reducing vulnerability to erratic rainfall and enhancing agricultural productivity. By creating reliable sources of water, the program not only prevents soil erosion but also builds climate resilience and strengthens livelihoods. A key feature of the program is its emphasis on community participation, encouraging local residents to actively adopt and sustain water management practices.

As part of this program, CES successfully completed a pond rejuvenation project in Bengaluru Rural. Prior to intervention, the pond was heavily silted, contaminated, and unsuitable for use. Restoration works included 797 cubic meters of desilting, 527 sq. m of stone revetment, 171 sq. m of stepping stones, plantation of 20 medicinal saplings, installation of 70 fencing poles with 540 meters of barbed wire, and RCC pipe works.

The rejuvenated pond now has a storage capacity of 31 lakh liters, significantly enhancing water availability for agriculture, livestock, and domestic needs. The initiative has directly benefitted 56 households and indirectly supported 735 households, impacting a total of 2,800+ beneficiaries across the village. Covering an area of 823 sq. m, the project also created 50 person-days of local employment, contributing to livelihood generation during implementation.

Prison Reformation

Charvi Empowerment Society (CES), in collaboration with the District Prison authorities (Kasna Jail), implemented a focused initiative to strengthen the mental and physical wellbeing of inmates. Designed as part of CES's prison reformation efforts, the program integrated the distribution of health kits and sports materials with a mental health awareness session, reaching and positively impacting more than 3340 inmates.

Health kits equipped with hygiene and wellness essentials were distributed to encourage healthier daily practices and improve personal care. To promote recreation and physical fitness, sports materials including footballs, carrom boards, and skipping ropes were provided. These not only enhanced opportunities for constructive engagement but also supported the development of discipline, teamwork, and positive use of leisure time.

The awareness session on mental wellbeing highlighted practical strategies for stress management, emotional resilience, and cultivating a positive mindset. The active involvement of the Deputy Jailer and prison officials added institutional strength and reinforced the commitment of the administration toward rehabilitation-focused reforms.

The initiative fostered a healthier and more engaging environment within the prison, with inmates expressing gratitude for the support. It reflects CES's vision of creating inclusive, rehabilitative correctional spaces that contribute to long-term reintegration and an improved quality of life for inmates.

STEM Lab Installation



I N T E R V E N T I O N S

I N T E R V E N T I O N S

The STEM Lab Installation Program is a transformative initiative designed to bridge the learning gap in STEM subjects for students from under-resourced schools. In 2024–25, the project successfully established STEM Mini Science Labs in five schools across Maharashtra, directly benefiting 3,816 students and engaging hundreds more indirectly through science fairs and community activities. In addition, 26 teachers were trained and equipped with innovative teaching methodologies to sustain and maximize the impact of the program.

Each lab was furnished with 92 working and DIY models, aligned with the academic curriculum in Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, and Geography. These hands-on resources promoted experiential learning, problem-solving, collaboration, and critical thinking, helping students overcome fear of complex subjects while stimulating long-term interest in STEM careers. Teachers, empowered through capacity-building sessions, began integrating these models into lesson plans, ensuring continuity and sustainable classroom innovation.

Beyond academic enrichment, the program facilitated school infrastructure improvements, including sanitation upgrades in select institutions, thereby creating a healthier and more conducive environment for learning.

Early outcomes highlight improved test performance, increased classroom participation, and enhanced confidence among students, particularly girls who were engaged through focused STEM activities. This initiative has established a strong foundation for equitable and inclusive STEM education, equipping young learners with 21st-century skills and fostering a culture of scientific curiosity and innovation in underserved communities.

Agriculture Sustainability

The Agriculture Sustainability Program 2024–25, implemented in Siddipet district, Telangana, was designed to empower farmers through sustainable agricultural practices, diversification of livelihoods, and improved market access. The program adopted a participatory approach, ensuring that interventions were both community-driven and scalable.

A Kisan Seva Kendra was established as a central hub for training and farmer engagement, supported by need assessment surveys and community mobilization to ensure inclusivity. To promote innovation and alternative livelihoods, three mushroom demonstration fields were set up, complemented by five specialized training workshops covering Milky, Oyster, Ganoderma, and Straw mushrooms. Farmers also received equipment such as solar dryers, humidifiers, and chaff cutters to sustain production cycles.

Additionally, 203 soil health tests were conducted, enabling farmers to adopt better crop and soil management practices. Specialized training was provided on organic farming, vermicomposting, livestock management, and entrepreneurship development, alongside an exposure visit that further enriched farmer learning. The program also facilitated the formation of a Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) to strengthen collective bargaining and market linkages.

Overall, the program benefitted 4,089 people, including 1,500+ farmers directly and 2,500+ indirect beneficiaries, resulting in improved productivity, higher incomes, and enhanced community resilience through sustainable and entrepreneurial agricultural practices.

Entrepreneurship Development

Charvi Empowerment Society (CES) implemented an Entrepreneurship Development Program to strengthen livelihoods by providing skill training, enterprise development, and financial literacy to underprivileged communities. The initiative was designed to equip participants, particularly women, with practical skills and entrepreneurial capacities that enable them to achieve economic independence and contribute to household income.

The program delivered structured training modules on tailoring, garment-making, and other vocational trades, combining technical instruction with hands-on practice. To support enterprise readiness, CES provided participants with access to sewing machines, raw materials, and practical demonstrations. Alongside technical training, workshops on entrepreneurship development, business planning, and financial literacy helped participants understand market opportunities, customer relations, and savings mechanisms, preparing them to operate as micro-entrepreneurs.

The intervention directly benefitted 900+ families, creating avenues for both self-employment and group enterprise. The program emphasized women's empowerment, enabling beneficiaries to gain confidence, develop leadership qualities, and secure sustainable livelihoods.

Early outcomes include enhanced income-generating potential, improved financial awareness, and a foundation for long-term entrepreneurial ventures. By building local capacities, the program contributes to economic resilience, gender equality, and inclusive community development, aligning with CES's broader mission of sustainable empowerment.

Skill Development



Charvi Empowerment Society (CES) is dedicated to empowering individuals, particularly women and youth, through innovative skill development initiatives that promote economic independence and social transformation. The Skill Development Training Program was launched to provide participants with practical, market-oriented skills while fostering confidence, leadership, and self-reliance.

In 2024-25, the program reached 3,000+ direct beneficiaries and impacted over 15,000+ people including indirect beneficiaries through a combination of structured training, placement support, and livelihood generation activities. Training modules focused on vocational trades such as tailoring, garment-making, handicrafts, and other demand-driven skills aligned with both local and national market opportunities. By blending theoretical instruction with hands-on practice, the program ensured participants were job-ready and capable of pursuing both wage employment and self-employment.

Beyond technical training, participants attended entrepreneurship and financial literacy workshops, covering budgeting, pricing, customer engagement, and savings. This holistic approach equipped them with essential tools to build sustainable livelihoods. Furthermore, placement support and market linkages created avenues for securing dignified work and expanding entrepreneurial ventures.

The initiative has resulted in improved household incomes, enhanced gender equality, and stronger community resilience, enabling individuals to become self-reliant contributors to local and national development.

Solar/ ESG Sustainability



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The Solar Street Light Project, implemented in Tiruppur District, Tamil Nadu, stands as a significant step toward sustainable rural development and community empowerment. Designed to address the critical need for reliable street lighting, the initiative focused on enhancing safety, social well-being, and environmental sustainability through the installation of solar-powered streetlights across four villages.

The project outcomes have been both transformative and far-reaching. Villagers reported a marked increase in safety and security, particularly for women and children who now feel confident walking after dark. Enhanced illumination has also led to a reduction in petty crimes and improved road safety, decreasing accident risks for pedestrians and vehicles alike. Beyond safety, the initiative fostered social interaction and community bonding, with families and children spending more time outdoors in the evenings.

Economically, local shopkeepers benefited from increased evening business, while households experienced indirect advantages such as children being able to study under streetlights during power cuts. Environmentally, the project generated significant impact, reducing annual CO₂ emissions by an estimated 102.2 tonnes, directly contributing to India's commitment to Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 7: Affordable and Clean Energy, and SDG 13: Climate Action).

Recognized formally by all participating Gram Panchayats through certificates of appreciation, the project not only met its immediate objectives but also instilled pride, resilience, and hope within communities. By integrating sustainability with community needs, the "Solar Street Light" initiative stands as a replicable model for future rural electrification efforts across India.

Mobile Health Unit



The Mobile Health Unit Project was implemented across 24 villages in Tiruppur District, Tamil Nadu, with the objective of improving healthcare access, strengthening preventive practices, and promoting community-led health systems.

A baseline need assessment revealed critical gaps in healthcare awareness and access, with many villagers depending on unregulated practitioners. To address these challenges, the project deployed a Mobile Health Unit (MHU) equipped with a doctor, nurse, project manager, and vehicle support. Regular health camps were organized across villages, providing free doctor consultations, medicine distribution, BP and sugar testing, weight measurement, counseling, and health awareness sessions.

Over the course of the project, more than 30,000 patients were treated, covering men, women, children, and the elderly. A total of 289 health camps were conducted, while 785 patients with chronic or severe illnesses were referred to government facilities, ensuring access to advanced care. Women's health was a particular focus, with over 14,000 women benefiting from maternal and general healthcare services.

To encourage sustainability, Village Healthcare Committees (VHCs) were formed in all 24 villages, each with 10 members. The project also fostered collaboration with ASHA, Anganwadi, and PHC workers, creating strong linkages with existing government healthcare systems.

In total, the project directly impacted over 30,000 beneficiaries and indirectly reached 32,000+ individuals through awareness generation, improved health-seeking behaviors, and strengthened healthcare delivery systems. By establishing a sustainable referral mechanism, the initiative has laid a strong foundation for long-term health resilience in rural Tiruppur.

Determined to change her circumstances, Amrutha enrolled in the program. With structured guidance, skill-based training, and her own commitment, she successfully secured employment at Yostralabs Pvt. Ltd., Jalahalli Cross.

For her parents, this achievement was a moment of immense pride and relief. Seeing their daughter become independent and begin a professional career was life-changing. Amrutha's stable income and growing confidence soon transformed the financial condition of her household. From a family once struggling to make ends meet, they began experiencing a more secure and hopeful future.

Today, Amrutha continues to thrive in her career. What makes her journey remarkable is not only her success but also her commitment to give back. She frequently visits the CES training center where she studied, sharing her experiences and motivating current students. Life placed heavy burdens on Bhavana at a very young age. The loss of her father left the family devastated, but her mother, Varalakshmi, chose courage over despair. With sheer determination, she began working in a garments factory, starting with just ₹3,000 a month. Even after 17 years of relentless effort, her income rose only to ₹12,000—barely enough to cover food, rent, and her children's education.

Amid these hardships, Bhavana refused to let her circumstances define her future. While studying at Government First Grade College, Peenya, she seized an opportunity that would change her life. In 2024, she enrolled in the free job-oriented training and employment program organized by Charvi Empowerment Society (CES).

The program became a turning point, providing her with market-relevant skills, professional confidence, and career guidance. Armed with this support, Bhavana successfully secured employment in the billing and sales department at Wow Pizza. Her steady income not only made her financially independent but also allowed her to support her mother—the woman who sacrificed everything to secure her children's future. Today, Varalakshmi beams with pride as she watches her daughter step into a life of dignity and self-reliance.

Bhavana's journey goes beyond personal success; it is a story of resilience, opportunity, and transformation. She stands as a beacon of hope for countless young women, proving that with hard work, perseverance, and the right support system, challenges do not break us—they build the strength to rise higher and achieve greatness.

Manju H. S., son of farmer Suresh H. N., grew up amidst the daily struggles of an agricultural household. Like many farmers across the country, Suresh toiled relentlessly in the fields, not to accumulate wealth but to provide his children with opportunities he never had. With an annual income of barely ₹60,000, he managed both household expenses and education with difficulty. Despite hardships, the family held on to one unwavering belief: “No matter how hard life is, our children must have a better future.”

In 2024, Manju's journey took a transformative turn when he enrolled in the Customer Care Executive – Textile (Merchandise – Textile) training program organized by Charvi Empowerment Society (CES). The free program equipped him with industry-relevant skills, communication training, and the confidence to step into a professional career. The exposure and mentorship provided during the course enabled him to sharpen his abilities and dream beyond the limitations of his background.

With determination and the right guidance, Manju secured employment at Intertek Company, significantly improving his financial standing. His annual income rose to nearly ₹2.5 lakhs, a remarkable leap from his father's modest earnings. This achievement not only brought financial security to his family but also gave his parents a sense of dignity and pride, seeing their son achieve independence.

Today, Manju stands as a symbol of resilience and empowerment. His journey proves that with timely support, skill development, and determination, young people from even the most challenging circumstances can carve out a future filled with hope and opportunity.

Navneetha, a 32-year-old woman from rural Telangana, lives with her husband—who drives an auto rickshaw—and their two young sons. Despite her husband’s hard work, the family often struggled to meet daily expenses, leaving Navneetha determined to contribute financially and secure a better future for her children.

Her opportunity came through the Agriculture Sustainability Program, where she was introduced to mushroom cultivation. This initiative immediately appealed to her as it required low investment but offered the potential for steady income. With the training team’s guidance, she learned every step of the process—from preparing the mushroom beds with straw to maintaining hygiene and ensuring proper growth conditions.

Encouraged by the supportive environment, Navneetha set up a small mushroom unit at her home. Her very first harvest brought a sense of accomplishment, as the produce quickly found buyers in the local market. The earnings provided her family with much-needed financial relief, while also boosting her confidence as an independent contributor to the household.

Today, Navneetha’s efforts are recognized within her community, where she stands as an example for other women striving to support their families. She plans to expand her mushroom production and explore larger markets, aiming to build a stable and sustainable livelihood. Her journey reflects the power of skill-building and determination in transforming lives.

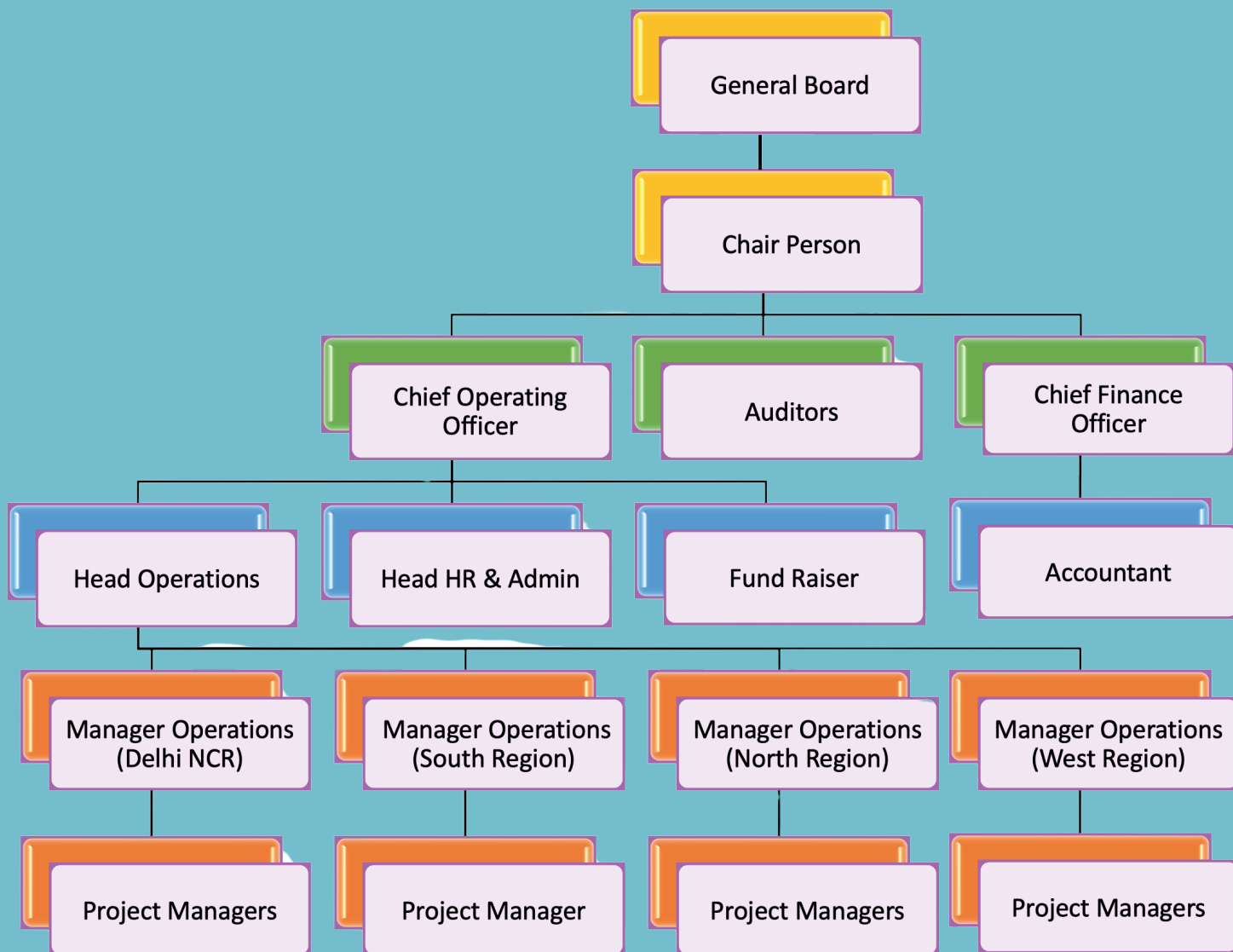
